9 facts you should know about organic cotton

- 1. **Seeds** are untreated and never genetically engineered.
- 2. **The soil** in which the seeds are harvested is strengthened through <u>crop rotation</u>, compost application and the use of cover cropping and mulch. It also retains water more efficiently because of the increased organic matter.
- 3. **Weeds** are removed physically instead of with toxic chemicals, and they are further controlled through cultivation and hand hoeing.
- 4. **Pests** are controlled through the use beneficial insects that are natural predators. Trap crops also may be planted, to lure some insects away from the <u>cotton</u>.
- 5. **Harvesting** relies mostly on seasonal freeze for defoliation and, on occasion, defoliation may also be stimulated through water management.
- 6. **Certified organic cotton is certified** by independent third-party certifying bodies.
- Gin, spinning, knitting and weaving machinery is cleaned out before use to avoid any contamination.
- 8. **During dyeing and finishing**, only chemicals and materials that meet organic processing standards are used. Dyed products should conform to the Ecological and Toxicological Association of Dyes and Organic Pigment Manufactures (ETAD) agreement standards.
- 9. **During cutting and sewing**, organic fabric is clearly identified and tracked.
